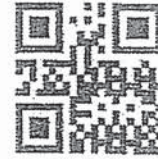

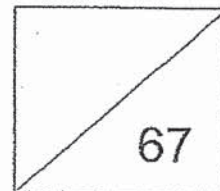

After having studied overseas for five years, I returned to my hometown in Hsin Li Valley. Nothing seemed to have changed — the red brick houses and the villagers' slow-paced lifestyles. I sat behind the counter of my parents' grocery shop, watching people pass by. My parents sold provisions like cooking oil, rice and sugar. There was no demand for luxury items. The people here lived humbly, content with just having enough food on the table. 5

Just then, a little short-haired girl came into the shop with an empty bottle in her hand to buy some peanut oil. Her appearance startled me. She looked familiar and yet, I could not recall where I had met her. After she left, my mother asked, "Do you know who she is?" 10

I shook my head, totally clueless. My mother smiled and said, "She's Hui Lan's daughter."

"Hui Lan's daughter? Hui Lan is back in Hsin Li Valley too?" I could hardly believe my ears. Nodding, my mother related how miserable Hui Lan's life had been since she left the village twenty years ago. 15

Hui Lan and I had been classmates and childhood friends. She was intelligent, quick-witted and the most courageous girl I had ever met! I recalled one incident which was deeply etched in my mind. In order to earn some extra income, my mother made me sell homemade buns to my teachers and classmates. I dreaded doing it as I was extremely shy. I was afraid that they would laugh at me for being poor. 20 Sensing my reluctance, Hui Lan scooped out the buns from my bag and persuaded the other students to buy them. In just a few minutes, she sold all the buns and even took some future orders. I felt indebted to her from then on. That afternoon, I could not stop thinking about Hui Lan and her children. Life had been kinder to me than her. Was there any way I could lend a helping hand to my friend and her family? But what could I do to help? That evening my mother accompanied me to Hui Lan's house. Upon arrival at the sparsely furnished house, a middle-aged woman greeted us. She could easily pass off as my mother's sister — their ages seemed to be quite close. Noticing that I was staring at her intently, she appeared somewhat embarrassed and stammered, "It's been a long time since we met. You have put on some weight, Meng Yi." I regained my composure and tried to say something to hide the awkwardness. What had happened to the once youthful girl I knew? Nevertheless, we chatted for a while. 30 35
