There are many varieties of goldfish, of which some can grow up to 16 inches long. If you are tight on space, a fancy goldfish is a better fit for you. Fancy goldfish have two tails and a shorter (17) body, so they do not require much room.

While most goldfish can <u>put up with</u> poor water quality occasionally, it is important to note that (18)

they can produce a lot of waste. When the water quality is poor, it can <u>stunt</u> the fish's growth, often resulting in deformed appearances and death.

Small tanks are not appropriate homes for goldfish as proper filtration systems cannot be (20)

properly installed in them. Goldfish should be kept in large aquariums to ensure their health and survival.





"I am sorry, Mum. I lied to you as I did not want anyone to know I was helping him." Ruby apologised. I knelt down and pulled her in for a tight embrace. I assured her that I would never get mad at her for wanting to help someone. Later that day, I had a talk with Mrs Ng and told her what Ruby had said. I then learnt that John was the eldest of four boys and their parents were struggling to make ends meet. Getting school supplies for the boys was not their priority.

As Christmas neared, the thought of John and his family weighed heavily on my 20 mind. What would they do? Surely they would not have money for gifts, Considering their predicament, my mind was set on helping them.

When my family began our preparation for our annual Christmas celebration, I told my husband and my children that instead of the usual gift exchange, we would go shopping for gifts and groceries for John's family. Needless to say, my children and I were delighted 25 to pick things out for the four boys. Ruby was especially interested in things for John. At home, the children wrapped the gifts while my husband and I unpacked the groceries and stored them in our big refrigerator.

To respect Ruby's wish to remain anonymous, I roped in my three brothers to help with the delivery. The next moming, they loaded the treasures into their car boots and set 30 out for the address given by Mrs Ng. Upon their return, my brothers recounted the visit. A petite lady appeared shortly after they knocked on the door. She was dumbfounded upon seeing them with arms full of gifts and bags full of groceries. They walked past a few blankets and a small television in the sparsely furnished flat, before setting the bags down on the kitchen counter. My brothers' eyes widened at how little the family had. They were 35 at a loss for words for a moment. Before John and his family could ask any questions, my brothers just left them with shouts of "Merry Christmas!"

Ruby never told a soul in school about what we did. Yet, she would come home daily beaming widely, telling of John's new clothes and how other kids now played with him, treating him like the rest of the children.


