



Dengue fever is a disease transmitted by the bite of an infected female Aedes
mosquito. A mosquito is infected (51) it consumes a blood meal
from a dengue-infected person. This disease is (52) in the regions
of Southeast Asia and in Singapore. Dengue fever presents itself
(53) flu-like symptoms that show up about two to fourteen days
after the victim has been bitten by (54) infected mosquito. If it is a
(55) case, the symptoms will resolve on their own within two to
seven days. In severe cases, an infected person will show symptoms like persistent
vomiting, serious abdominal pain and internal bleeding. An individual who
(56) treatment at this stage, could die.
In Singapore, the dengue menace remains a thorn in Singapore's side
(57) the relentless efforts to combat it. Instead of having reduced
dengue cases each year, dengue is striking (58) with a vengeance.
Dengue cases were low for the years 2017 and 2018. However, by the first half of 2019,
dengue cases had risen rapidly. It is a signal that Singapore could be heading towards a
major dengue (59)this year. Why is this happening? Warming
temperatures brought about by climate change will make mosquito eggs hatch faster.
This (60) the time it takes for a mosquito to become a biting adult.
Additionally, the hotter weather allows the pests to venture farther afield. Thus, that helps
to (61)dengue's range. This would mean that mosquitoes can now
thrive in more places where they could not do so (62)
More can be done to (63)mosquito breeding in the bud in
order to prevent the rise of dengue cases. Doing the "10-minute 5-step Mozzie Wipe-out"
routine regularly helps to keep our homes free of the Aedes mosquito. It clears the
breeding grounds of the mosquitoes by (64) stagnant water sources
that sit inside and outside of our houses. Next, prevent mosquito bites by applying insect
(65), wearing long covered clothing and sleeping under mosquito
nets. By following these measures, we can save ourselves from the dengue menace.
